STD Prevention Program. The purpose of this grant application and the mission of the Arkansas Department of Health's Sexually Transmitted Disease (STD) Prevention Program (ADHSTDP), is to significantly reduce and prevent sexually transmitted infections and diseases in the State of Arkansas. The ADHSTDP will emphasize the core public health functions of assessment, assurance, and policy development and focus on prevention activities within each of these functions. Within the assessment function, the following activities will be prioritized: conducting, surveillance, monitoring of screening rates, assessing gaps in service, building capacity to monitor and address antibiotic resistance to gonorrhea, congenital syphilis, and other emerging STDs. The assurance function will prioritize: assuring effective screening and treatment services are available to at-risk populations; providing partner services, including linkage to care; assuring health education and promotion programs are available to providers and at-risk populations. The three activities prioritized for policy development will be: monitoring and evaluating the impact of policies; educating the public, providers and stakeholders on effective policy; and collaborating with primary care providers to expand access to STD prevention services.
