Type of Service to be rendered:

- **To increase the capacity and infrastructure of victim service programs (rape crisis centers) to provide services to individuals who have been trafficked;**
- **To provide specific training to crisis centers for more focused advocacy;**
- **To enable rape crisis centers to hire an employee who will:**
  - **coordinate and enhance collaboration with other community resources,**
  - **provide direct services to victims of trafficking,**
  - **provide training and technical assistance to other agencies, such as law enforcement, and**
  - **create community awareness; and**
- **To create a Human Trafficking Resource Center that will have the capacity to house adult victims of human trafficking.**

Program Description provided by the Applicant (from Executive Summary on Proposal Template):

Because the COVID-19 pandemic exacerbated living conditions and caused financial crisis for families contributing to an increased risk for exploitation, the ACASA plans to use these funds to promote a response to the pandemic and economic recovery process by increasing the capacity of ACASA accredited victim service programs [rape crisis centers] to provide services to individuals who have been trafficked. We also plan to increase access to services and improve service quality to Human Trafficking victims who have experienced barriers in obtaining services throughout the COVID-19 pandemic. The ACASA will use funding to increase the capacity of ACASA accredited victim service programs to provide community education and awareness of human trafficking using the public health model of primary prevention. Lastly, victims' ability to report and locate resources will be increased by providing website accessibility for language, hearing impairments, and visual disabilities.

Program Delivery Dates: October 1, 2021-December 31, 2026 (5 years plus 3 months).

Eligible Per CTEH/Hagerty Review:

ARPA offers support to specific community-based organizations to provide culturally specific activities for survivors of sexual assault and domestic violence, to address emergent needs resulting from COVID-19 public health emergency.

Recipients may use payments from the Fiscal Recovery Funds to facilitate access to resources that improve health outcomes, including services that connect residents with health care resources and public assistance programs including assistance accessing or applying for public benefits or services.

This program is eligible.
